### **Execution time**

The survey was conducted in 2022 in the spring semester.

## **Purpose**

Survey of Alumni 6 month after completing studies.

# **Short presentation of the questionnaire**

The survey consists out of 10 questions. The average of the evaluations was calculated by analyzing the results. In the survey participated 10 Alumni.

# **Presentation of survey results:**

60% of the respondents answered, that are working in the field of the study programme; 10% have a high qualification needed job; 30% have a low qualification needed job. 100% of the respondents do work at the enterprise in the private sector. 80% of the respondents answered, that were working during the studies; 20% - were employed within one month after graduation.

70% - work in Vilnius, 30% are employed abroad. 60% of the respondents have declared that the job profile matches the completed studies. 60% answered – that studies met the expectations; Acquired knowledge and skills are applicable in the job market; The practice activities during the studies were beneficial; It was easy to find a job after completing the studies. Respondents noted, that they would like to improve their work skills regarding constantly changing tendencies in the hospitality market. Graduates have noticed that establishing themselves in the labor market is influenced by both: preparation in higher education institution and personal characteristics.
